All students planning to start paramedic (PMD) designated courses MUST hold a valid New York State Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certification and have done so for minimum of 3 months.

NYS EMT certification is achievable via EMT 110 (8cr), which is offered in the fall, spring and summer semesters.

All students must possess a valid New York State Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certification when enrolled in any paramedic (PMD) designated course.


Eligibility to take the New York State Paramedic practical and written examinations is achieved after successfully completing all nine (9) paramedic (PMD) courses, and human anatomy and physiology, or with departmental permission.

Prior to starting paramedic (PMD) courses, all students must meet with the EMT/Paramedic Program Director/advisor for specific information.

How to Access Degree Works


Degree Works is a comprehensive, easy-to-use, web-based tool designed to help students and advisors monitor progress towards program completion.

1. Log into MyCollege




A screenshot of a login form with two input fields: 'USERNAME:' and 'PASSWORD:'. Below the password field is a 'Log In' button.

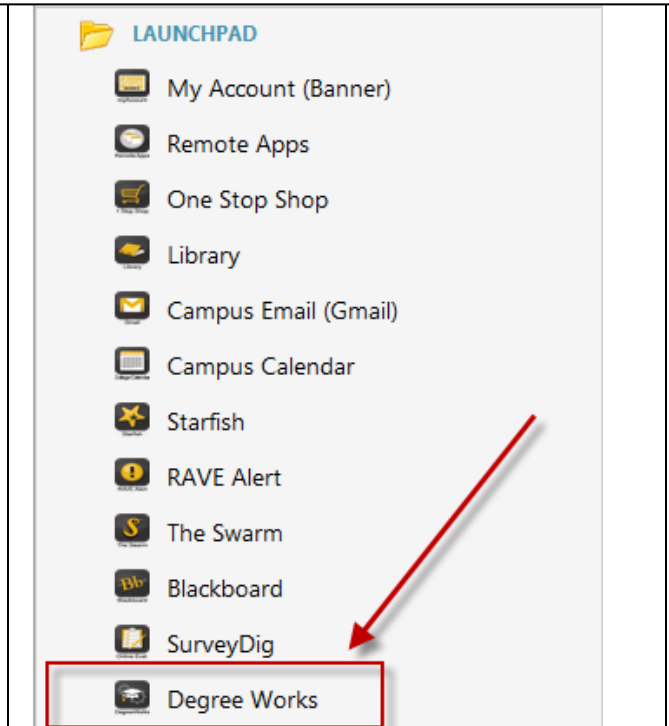
