

## PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

**Keuka College**

and

**State University of New York Broome Community College Program of Nursing**

### I. INTRODUCTION AND OBJECTIVES

In compliance with the transfer policy the document herewith has been drafted between SUNY Broome Community College of Nursing and the nursing division of Keuka College. The intent is to facilitate those students of SUNY Broome Community College of Nursing who have completed the nursing program transferring to Keuka College to complete the Bachelor's Degree in Nursing.

### II. KEUKA COLLEGE TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

**A. Admission: To qualify for admission to the RN to BSN major at Keuka, SUNY Broome Community College (BCC) of Nursing graduates must:**

- A. Complete the application and submit all official transcripts to Keuka College, 141 Central Ave. Keuka Park, NY 14478 no later than July 1 for fall admission and December 1 for spring admission, and be admitted to the college.
- B. Submit a successful program application, to Keuka College's RN to BSN program;
- C. Achieve a cumulative minimum grade point average of 2.50 while at BCC;
- D. Complete the recommended major prerequisite courses or course equivalents listed below with a grade of "C" or better;
  - BUS 320 Statistics (4 credits) at Keuka College OR MAT 124 or 224 Statistics at SUNY BCC
  - PHL 115 Ethics (3 credits) at Keuka College OR PHL 201 Ethics at SUNY BCC
  - ENG 300 College Writing for Transfer Students (4 credits) at Keuka College (No current SUNY BCC Equivalency)
- E. Graduate from SUNY BCC and pass the NCLEX examination, and achieve licensure as a Registered Professional Nurse in the State of New York

\*\*\* All SUNY Broome Community College Nursing program students who have met the above criteria will have a guaranteed spot in the RN to BSN program; however, those who apply later in the admissions process may have to defer their acceptance for a semester if the cohort in question is already filled. For example, students who apply for a fall admission June 15<sup>th</sup> may be admitted but have to defer their start to the spring cohort if fall cohort is already full at the time of their acceptance.

PHL115 Ethics prerequisite (3 credits) see page 1 for equivalencies
BUS320 Statistics prerequisite (4 credits) see page 1 for equivalencies
ENG 300 College Writing for Transfer Students ( 4 credits)
BUS 320, <i>(4 credits)</i> , SUNY BCC-PHL 115, <i>(3 credits)</i> , BK II Elective or equivalent SUNY BCC course, <i>3 credits</i> + 19 credits Liberal Arts + 2 credits General Education SUNY BCC-HST 210 =a total of 31 credits of general education coursework
All other course work taken at SUNY BCC Nursing Program

Students who wish to complete their general education courses prior to transferring into the RN to BSN program may do so by taking courses at SUNY Broome Community Nursing Program that would fulfill general education courses needed for completion of a Bachelor's degree at Keuka College. They may also complete the requirements through the Keuka College's Center for Professional Studies online program

### C. Total Transfer Credit

#### 1. From two-year colleges.

- a. Students holding an approved associate degree from a regionally accredited college may transfer credits to meet the General Education requirements of Keuka College. Such students will automatically be granted at least 60 credits and junior status. A student must take at least 30 credits from Keuka College for a BS in Nursing degree

#### 2. From four-year colleges. A total of 90 credits may be accepted for transfer from any regionally accredited four-year college or university.

3. **In addition to transfer credits brought in from coursework completed at SUNY Broome Community College Department of Nursing**, passing the NCLEX exam is considered the equivalent of a challenge exam for up to twenty seven upper division nursing credits for an

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



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**V. ASSISTANCE TO STUDENTS**




