<u>SUNY Broome Community College</u> acknowledges an authorized representative of the institution has signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

<u>SUNY Broome Community College</u> has received \$4,364,871 from the Department of Education pursuant to the Certification and Agreement for which 50% (\$2,182,436) is designated as Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

^{*} Pell Recipients may receive a base award dependent on EFC. These students had additional costs of utilities and personal expenses as result being asked to proceed in an online format. Our highest need students (0-1000 EFC) had no money to cover these expenses. The max base award of \$650 is derived from the Consumer Price Index and Cost of Attendance for 19-20.

Base Grant for High Need (Displaced Students) \$1550*

2nd Round CARES Emergency Grant- Application Period through July 15th, 2020

All Eligible Title IV Recipients \$225*

*Base awards were determined based on availability of funds for all students and the Consumer Price Index for the timeframe (Spring 2020) in which the campus was impacted. \$225 represents base cost of personal expenses for impacted timeframe. Students who received funds in the 1st Round may apply for additional funds in this round.

^{*}Base awards were determined based on availability of funds for all high need students. The award is derived from Consumer Price Index and Cost of Attendance for the 2 months during the semester these students were displaced due to Campus disruptions. These students will also be eligible for a Course Materials Replacement award.

Under Section 18004(a) (1) of the CARES Act, eligible students will receive awards ranging from \$225 to \$2200

All students will be notified of eligibility, requirements, and application availability by SUNY Broome email.

Students are required to certify and attest that they have or will incur allowable expenses of food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, childcare, and/or transportation as a result of the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus.
