**About this agreement:**

SUNY Broome and Marywood University have agreed to a correlation of their curricula for students in the Associate in Applied Science: Accounting program at SUNY Broome who wish to complete the Bachelor of Business Administration: Accounting degree at Marywood University. Subject to the terms of this agreement, a student who satisfactorily completes the requirements of the AAS degree at SUNY Broome with a 2.5 grade point average or above, will be granted admission to Marywood University and will have his/her credits earned with a grade of 'C' or better, accepted for transfer based on the articulation agreement equivalency. However, the following terms and conditions shall apply:

- 1) A minimum of 120 credits are required for an undergraduate BBA: Accounting degree at Marywood University.
- 2) Transfer students using this agreement ONLY must **complete a minimum of 30 credits at Marywood.**
- 3) Students must maintain a 2.33 GPA in their major, and a 2.0 overall GPA in order to graduate from Marywood.
- 4) This agreement is to be used as a guide only. **Marywood University cannot guarantee that the needed courses will be offered in a given semester.**
- 5) The University estimates that a student can earn her/his BBA: Accounting in two years provided s/he follows the articulation agreement.
- 6) The student must meet all deadline dates for application to the University, payment of fees, and any other deadlines as they apply to all new students at Marywood.
- 7) The student shall choose the recommended elective courses and course sequences as shown on the articulation agreement.
- 8) The student must not attend another institution of higher education between graduating from SUNY Broome and enrolling at Marywood University.

If any of the above terms and conditions are not met, Marywood University shall determine the appropriate number of transfer credits on an individual basis.

Students who wish to transfer to Marywood University prior to obtaining their Associate's degree from SUNY Broome must submit their official transcript for a course-by-course evaluation.

This agreement may be terminated at any time by either Marywood University or SUNY Broome via a written notice thirty days in advance of the effective date of termination. It is understood that any termination will not apply to students who have already started the Associate Degree program in Accounting at SUNY Broome or the Bachelor of Business Administration: Accounting program at Marywood University.
