

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
between
WELLS COLLEGE AND BROOME COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Wells College, a four year private coeducational liberal arts college and accredited by The Middle States Association enters into a direct Transfer Agreement with *Broome Community College* also accredited by The Middle States Association.

- I. Students who are eligible for the agreement will meet the following criteria:
 - a. Complete the Associate of Science or Associate of Arts degree in the area of liberal arts and sciences before entrance into Wells College.
 - b. Complete the admissions application process.
 - c. Meet the academic requirements for admission to be an accepted student.

- II. The Articulation Agreement ensures that the student have the following opportunities:
 - a. Students will be granted two years of credit (60 semester hours) toward a Baccalaureate Degree without further review of their record, giving them junior standing.
 - b. Students will be eligible to apply for the Wells College Transfer Scholarship. This is a merit-based scholarship. Contact the admissions office for details about the application deadline, process, and criteria.
 - c. Transfer students are also eligible for financial aid consideration and housing accommodations as all other entering students.
 - d. All Broome Community College graduates admitted to Wells College under the terms of this agreement shall be eligible to participate in internships, field placements, and study abroad programs as open to native Wells College students.

- III. Additionally:
 - a. The appropriate administrative offices of the institutions shall discuss substantive changes in courses or programs of either institution possibly affecting this agreement.
 - b. Candidates should discuss their proposed major with an appropriate instructor at Wells to determine their ability to complete their major field in two years.
 - c. Students who do not meet the criteria for admission will not be eligible for this agreement.
 - d. Students need two semesters of a foreign language to complete their degree at Wells College. It would benefit the student to complete this requirement at Broome Community College if possible. This would allow the student the time necessary to concentrate on their major and graduate in a timely manner.
 - e. The requirements for the education certification may be difficult to complete in two years of full-time study, even if the student has junior


standing. Students who know they want to transfer to Wells College at the time they register for classes at Broome Community College should contact the Director of Transfer & Continuing Education Admission, and the Chair of Education Certification at Wells College. If the student has decided to transfer to Wells with a completed program they should meet with the education faculty at Wells to determine what courses the student needs and how long it will take to accomplish the degree program.

- f. Students are required to complete 60 semester hours in residence at Wells College to receive the Bachelor of Arts degree.
- g. A final transcript with verification of the associate's degree having been awarded will be required before entrance to Wells.
- h. To assist Broome Community College in its outcomes assessment, the Wells College Office of Transfer Admission agrees to regularly inform Broome Community College of the progress of its graduates who transfer to Wells College.

This articulation agreement will be effective immediately after the representatives of both colleges sign the agreement. It may be modified upon mutual agreement; either party upon written notification may terminate it.
