5.0 INFORMATION ITEMS

5.1 President's Report – Dr. Kevin Drumm

Dr. Drumm welcomed and introduced new student trustee Alejandro Chavarria. Gonzalez. Thank you to all the trustees and especially this past year. Enrollment is strong with 8% up in FTE before the BAP numbers are included. Thanks to the Enrollment team. Thank you to the trustees for attending Commencement. Dr. Drumm attending the Frank G. Paul medal scholarship event which honors the top high school STEM students. Thank you to the facilities/maintenance team for making the campus look beautiful. Thank you to Justine Dadamio for coordinating all the end-of-the-year events. Congratulations to Chair Kathy Connerton for receiving the Distinguished Citizen Award on May 10th. Dr. Drumm distributed his formal retirement letter to the board.

5.2 College Assembly - Erin Marulli

Thank you in advance for the board to consider the approval of the new restructured Shared Governance Constitution. Shared Governance hosted the spring Your Voice Matters on April 6, 2023, reviewed and voted on FCCC resolutions, and the major focus was on the Shared Governance Restructure recommendations and constitution edits.

As a quorum was established, the meeting returned to item 1.0 Meeting Minutes

5.3 Student Affairs – Dr. Carol Ross-Scott

Dr. Ross's focus for this month is on the engagement and persistence of special cohorts such as students in EOP, student-athletes, student leaders, single parents, residents, and affinity group members. June 5-11 the college will host visiting students from Salia Mexico. The Childcare Task Force met and the center will operate with no changes for this year. The group will be looking at the infrastructure and other areas like accreditation. Dr. Carol will co-chair with Trustee Barbara Fiala. Dr. Ross-Scott introduced EOP Director Venessa Rodriguez who presented on the EOP program.

5.4 Student Assembly Update - Alejandro Chavarria Gonzalez

Student Trustee Chavarria Gonzalez reported the Student Assembly elected new executive board members and senators for the upcoming academic year. The student body also approved an amended constitution that better reflects the roles and responsibilities of assembly members. A pending issue was shared with Council on Academic Issues and Executive Council.

5.5 **BCC Foundation Report – Cathy Williams**

The Foundation has a net surplus of \$2.62 million. Contributing to this was a \$750K estate gift. The direct mail appeals have raised \$89,380 from over 600 donors in the fiscal year 2023. The Broome Magazine was distributed, and Dr. Drumm was a feature article. Alumni weekend was held on April 27 and 29th with 90 attendees at the Friday mixer. Saturday was the picnic and Baseball field dedication. Alumni night is July 14 at the Binghamton Rumble Ponies. The time capsule will be buried on June 22, 2023. The Frank Paul Medal ceremony was on May 23rd. The Foundation's merit scholarship event was held on May 9th with more than 600 people attending.

5.6 Facilities Update - Dave Ligeikis

Construction of the fitness court is completed. The third pavilion is completed and all three are furnished with new furniture and solar lighting for safety. Contracts for the Old Science/Student Services restroom project have been finalized. An RFP for the Old Science to Student Union conversion was advertised. Bids for HVAC replacement in the Student Center/West Gym were opened on May 1st. Electric facilities repair for the damage incurred during the power outage will take place on May 27th. Preliminary designs for the Decker renovation project are being reviewed. HR office work in the Student Services building is anticipated to start in mid-June.

5.7 **Budget and Finance Update – Michael Sullivan**

5.7.1 FY 2022-23 Budget Forecast

There are between \$15 and 20 million dollars of capital projects in progress around the campus. The monthly forecast is the same as the last several months. The college will need \$3.8 million in Federal Stimulus funds to balance the budget. HEERF Funds

must be allocated by June 30th. College administration and trustees meet with the County Executive on May 1 to review the Proposed Budget and sustainability plan. The Student Housing is close to refinancing. Proposed tuition rates will be presented at the June board meeting.
