#### 1.0 INFORMATION ITEMS

# 1.1 President's Report – Dr. Tony D. Hawkins

Dr. Hawkins thanked the trustees for visiting the College Food Pantry and Broome Closet. SUNY Broome was picked the #2 Best Community College in the State of New York by EdSmart. Enrollment has increased for the 2<sup>nd</sup> week in a row. FTEs are still down. The increase in enrollment was due to Fast Forward registrations. Dr. Hawkins has attended several Black History Month events, continuing the legacy and contributions of the Black Community in our area. On February 4, he held a Supervisors Forum to meet the directors and supervisors on campus. This was an open meeting to discuss operational issues. The first Strategic Plan meeting was held this week, co-chaired by Trustee Testani and Dr. Kim McLain. SUNY recently awarded the college a \$197,966 grant for internship programs in Hospitality, Engineering Technologies, and Computer Sciences.

#### 1.2 Student Affairs – Dr. Carol Ross-Scott

A copy of Dr. Ross-Scott's report is in the packet. Dr. Ross-Scott introduced Lorie Brewer, Supplemental Support Services Coordinator in the office of the Dean of Students. Ms. Brewer presented a report to the trustees featuring the newly renovated Hornet Hope Center (Food Pantry) and Broome Closet which was funded by a grant from the Avangrid Foundation.

# 1.3 Student Assembly Update

Trustee Gonzalez was unable to attend. Student Assembly Vice President for Student Affairs Hiba Khan stated there was no activity to report on.

# 1.4 BCC Foundation Report – Cathy Williams

Ms. William's report is in the packet. There are currently 86 Alumni signed up for the Alumni Black Bear hockey game event. The magazine is in the design phase. Spring scholarship applications are now open and the Foundation has received 209 applications to date. A

# 1.5 Facilities Update – Dave Ligeikis

Mr. Ligeikis' report is in the packet and for information purposes. Building permits are pending from Broome County. The mini-master plan user group met on January 23. Decker renovation costs are being reviewed, the team will now develop a construction strategy and timeline. Facilities have built a shed roof off the CEC to prevent any ice or weather damage to the building compressors.
