Students are responsible for reviewing their Degree Works in MyCollege to verify graduation requirements. Run and review your Degree Works at least once a semester. If you have questions, contact your Paramedic advisor.

Students can only start paramedic (PMD) designated courses of study in the fall semesters.

Prior to starting the paramedic (PMD) designated courses, students must:

- Hold a valid New York State (NYS) Department of Health (DOH) EMT-Basic certification for minimum of 3 months.
- Have a minimum of 1 year of EMT crew-chief experience or successful completion of a minimum of 70 hours of BLS ambulance clinical time.

NYS DOH EMT certification is achievable by successful completion of the EMT 110 course (8cr), which is offered in the fall, spring and summer semesters.

Students must maintain valid NYS DOH EMT-Basic certification for the entire duration of the program.

Eligibility to take the New York State Paramedic practical and written examinations is achieved after successfully completing all nine (9) paramedic (PMD) courses, Introduction to Anatomy and Physiology or Anatomy & Physiology I or II or department permission

Prior to starting paramedic (PMD) courses, all students must meet with the Paramedic Program Director for specific information.
