Students can only start Paramedic (PMD) designated courses of study in the fall semesters.

Prior to starting the Paramedic (PMD) designated courses, students must:

- Hold a valid New York State (NYS) EMT Certification or higher.
- NYS EMT Certification is achievable by successful completion of the EMT 110 course (8cr), which is offered in the fall, spring, and summer semesters.
- Crew-Chief experience with agency.

Students must maintain valid NYS EMT-Basic Certification for the entire duration of the program.

Eligibility to take the New York State Paramedic practical and written examinations is achieved after successfully completing all Paramedic (PMD) courses, Introduction to Anatomy and Physiology, or Anatomy & Physiology I or II.

Prior to starting Paramedic (PMD) courses, all students must meet with the Paramedic Program Director for specific information.

Students who prefer less than the recommended courses each semester will need to consider taking courses during the summer and winter semesters in order to complete the program in two (2) years.
