

SUNY Broome Community College acknowledges an authorized representative of the institution has signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

SUNY Broome Community College has received \$4,364,871 from the Department of Education pursuant to the Certification and Agreement for which 50% (\$2,182,436) is designated as Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

SUNY Broome Community College has distributed **\$1,510,895** under Section 18004(a) (1) of the CARES Act as of 09/30/2020

SUNY Broome Community College has determined **2,945 students** at the institution are potentially eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

2nd Round CARES Emergency Grant- Application Period

Students requiring funds above and beyond 1st round Base Grant

Under Section 18004(a) (1) of the CARES Act, eligible students will receive awards ranging from **\$225 to \$2225**

All students will be notified of eligibility, requirements, and application availability by SUNY Broome email.

Students are required to certify and attest that they have or will incur allowable expenses of food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, childcare, and/or transportation as a result of the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus.
