TO

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN CRIMINOLOGY

Broome Community College (SUNY Broome) and Wilkes University have agreed to a correlation of their curricula for students in the above mentioned degree program who wish to complete the B.A. in Criminology at Wilkes University. Subject to the terms of this agreement, a student who satisfactorily completes the requirements of the degree at SUNY Broome with a 2.0 grade point average (GPA) or above, will be granted admission to Wilkes University and will have his or her credits earned, with a grade of 2.0 or above, accepted for transfer based on the attached course equivalency. The following terms and conditions, however, will apply:

1. the student must meet deadline dates for application, payment of fees, etc. that would normally apply to other new students at Wilkes University; and
2. the student shall choose the recommended elective courses and course sequences as agreed to on the attached course equivalency sheet.
 - If either of the above terms or conditions is not met, Wilkes University shall determine the appropriate transfer of credit on an individual basis.
 - Coursework completed at an institution other than SUNY Broome is not covered under this agreement and will be evaluated for transfer on a course-by-course basis.
 - The student who does not meet the 2.0 GPA requirement should contact the Wilkes University Office of Admissions for options.

Students who wish to transfer to Wilkes University prior to qualifying for the Associate Degree in Criminal Justice at Broome Community College (SUNY Broome) must submit their transcript for evaluation on a course-by-course basis by Wilkes University.


The student is not required to take the courses in the same order as they appear in the articulation agreement. The student, however, should make changes only after consultation with an advisor.


This articulation agreement is subject to annual review by faculty in the respective departments at Wilkes University. Either Wilkes University or Broome Community College may terminate this agreement at any time via a written notice thirty days in advance of the effective date of termination. It is understood that any termination will not apply to students who have already started the Associate degree program in Criminal Justice towards the B.A. in Criminology at Wilkes University.
